Established in 1951, IOM is the leading inter-governmental organization in the field of migration and works closely with governmental, intergovernmental and non-governmental partners. The International Organization for Migration (IOM) is committed to the principle that humane and orderly migration benefits migrants and society. As the leading international organization for migration, IOM acts with its partners in the international community to: assist in meeting the growing operational challenges of migration management; advance understanding of migration issues; encourage social and economic development through migration, and; uphold the human dignity and well-being of migrants.

IOM has been active in Poland since 2002 under an agreement with the Polish government and conducts various migration programs, including activities supporting the integration of male and female migrants into Polish society. IOM in Poland implements projects aimed at the private sector to promote ethical recruitment, respect for the rights of migrants and migrant women as well as the elimination of forced labour from value chains and the prevention of human trafficking.

Context:

The conflict in Ukraine has led to the overspill of over four million forcibly displaced persons to Poland. As migratory flows continue unabated, IOM is urgently and significantly boosting its capacity in Poland to provide multi-sectoral assistance to respond to urgent emerging humanitarian needs in a dynamic context.

Under the overall supervision of the Chief of Mission and direct supervision of the National Programme Coordinator, the position holder will lead in the implementation of protection activities in close coordination with other protection partners, stakeholders, and authorities, with particular focus on child protection activities. The position holder will be responsible for the supervision of the child protection project assistant.

Core Functions / Responsibilities:

1. Draft and monitor the project implementation plan;
2. Lead the design and rollout of project outputs, including through relevant information collection and analysis;
3. Organize internal and external workshops, trainings, assessment visits and meetings;
4. Coordinate child protection project activities with relevant units and departments within IOM and project partners;
5. Produce project updates, briefings, presentations and project narrative reports, as well as coordinating visibility and communication activities about the project achievements with Communications and PSU units;

6. Coordinate and promote regular meetings with case management actors to discuss case management and collect feedback on existing risks, challenges, and gaps in service provision for protection cases;
7. Supervise the work of the child protection project assistant;
8. Undertake duty travel, as and when required;
9. Perform such other duties as may be assigned.

Required Qualifications and Experience

Education

- University degree in law or social sciences from an accredited academic institution with at least three years professional experience; or high school diploma with at least five years professional experience;
- Master's degree in above fields is an advantage.

Experience and Skills

- Experience in project implementation is required;
- Experience in implementing multi-stakeholder initiatives is required;
- Experience working in a humanitarian setting in a similar role is preferred;
- Experience and expertise in the areas of counter-trafficking, child protection and migrant vulnerabilities is preferred;
- Experience in liaising with governmental and diplomatic authorities and stakeholders, working in international organizations, non-government or government institutions/organization;
- Demonstrated ability to draft and prepare clear and concise formal correspondence and project reports;
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills in a multi-cultural setting;
- Strong organizational, facilitation, communication, writing and presentations skills;
- Proficient in a Microsoft Office environment and office software packages. Knowledge of spreadsheet and database packages, experience in handling of web-based management systems;
- Strong work ethics and commitment to humanitarian principles;
- Ability to work individually, as well as in a diverse team.

Languages

Fluency in **Polish** (written and oral) and **English** is required; working knowledge of **Ukrainian** or **Russian** is an advantage.
