The International Organization for Migration (IOM) is committed to the principle that humane and orderly migration benefits migrants and society. As the leading international organization for migration, IOM acts with its partners in the international community to: assist in meeting the growing operational challenges of migration management; advance understanding of migration issues; encourage social and economic development through migration, and; uphold the human dignity and well-being of migrants.

IOM has been active in Poland since 2002 under an agreement with the Polish government and conducts various migration programs, including activities supporting the integration of male and female migrants into Polish society. IOM in Poland implements projects aimed at the private sector to promote ethical recruitment, respect for the rights of migrants and migrant women as well as the elimination of forced labour from value chains and the prevention of human trafficking.

Context:

Under the overall supervision of the Chief of Mission (CoM) in Warsaw, Poland and direct supervision of the Field Project Coordinator, the Operations Assistant (Field support) is responsible for undertaking the following duties and responsibilities:

Core Functions / Responsibilities:

1. Act as liaison focal point with the Polish border guards at crossing points;
2. Provide Third-country nationals with information on their rights and coordinate with the Protection team on their needs;
3. Coordinate with Polish and Ukrainian border authorities for the safe passage of Third-country nationals into Poland;
4. Coordinate with IOM Warsaw referrals to accommodation;
5. Organize transportation for migrants to the city of identified accommodation;
6. Ensure liaison with IOM Warsaw "Meet and greet" team to guarantee handover in city of accommodation;
7. Record and process demographic and biographic information;
8. Identify vulnerabilities of migrants and monitor that vulnerable individuals are assisted in a manner that ensures their safety, security and comfort; report all issues immediately to the appropriate supervisor(s);
9. Maintain and ensure the confidentiality and integrity of all relevant paperwork in line with standards of conduct and data protection rules. Keep supervisors immediately informed of any

- issues requiring their attention or any on-compliance to SOPs or codes of conduct by IOM staff members or partners;
10. Undertake duty travel as requested;
 11. Perform such other duties as may be assigned.

Required Qualifications and Experience

Education

- High school degree/certificate with four years of relevant work experience; or
- University degree from an accredited academic institution with two years of relevant work experience.

Experience and Skills

- Prior Movement Operations, transportation-related experience an advantage;
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills in a multi-cultural setting;
- Strong organizational, facilitation, communication, writing and presentations skills;
- Logistical, practical and sensible mindset;
- Proficient in a Microsoft Office environment and office software packages;
- Knowledge of and/ or experience using relevant software tools;
- Strong work ethics and commitment to humanitarian principles;
- Driver license required

Languages

Fluency in **Polish, Ukrainian** and/or **Russian** is required, working knowledge of **English**. Knowledge of another language is an advantage.
